IPT for inquiry into fake encounters

Srinagar, June 6: The International People's Tribunal on Human Rights today sought inquiry into the alleged fake encounters in Valley.

"In April-May, troopers reportedly killed over 20 militants in encounters. These cases require transparent and independent investigations,†the statement issued by the Tribunal said.

It said on the intervening night of April 29-30, troopers killed Shehzad Ahmad, Riyaz Ahmad and Muhammad Shafi allegedly in a fake encounter in frontier district of Kupwara, claiming them to be â €œinfiltrating militants†from Pakistan.

The Tribunal released Buried Evidence: Unknown, Unmarked, and Mass Graves in Kashmir in December 2009, authored by Angana Chatterji, Parvez Imroz.

"The report documented 2,700 unknown, unmarked, and mass graves, containing 2,943+

bodies, across 55 villages in Bandipore, Varmul, and Kupwara,†it said.
