IPT for inquiry into fake encounters

Srinagar, June 6: The International People's Tribunal on Human Rights today sought inquiry into the alleged fake encounters in Valley.

In April-May, troopers reportedly killed over 20 militants in encounters. These cases require transparent and independent investigations, the statement issued by the Tribunal said.

It said on the intervening night of April 29-30, troopers killed Shehzad Ahmad, Riyaz Ahmad and Muhammad Shafi allegedly in a fake encounter in frontier district of Kupwara, claiming them to be infiltrating militants from Pakistan.

The Tribunal released Buried Evidence: Unknown, Unmarked, and Mass Graves in Kashmir in December 2009, authored by Angana Chatterji, Parvez Imroz.

The report documented 2,700 unknown, unmarked, and mass graves, containing 2,943+ bodies, across 55 villages in Bandipore, Varmul, and Kupwara, it said.
